Turn no-one away from synod, archbishop pleads

question:

One of Ireland's most-senior prelates has insisted that the planned synod gathering on the future of Catholicism must be open to all voices if it is to bring meaningful reform to the Church here. Archbishop Francis Duffy warned that the process would only be worthwhile if Church leaders can reach out to those who are not involved with the Church and those who feel hurt and alienated including women. Archbishop Duffy – who was installed as Archbishop of Tuam at the weekend – told The Irish Catholic the Irish synod should be open "as wide and to as many people as possible". He described the synodal process is "essential" as Ireland grapples with issues like the declining

number of priests and religious, as well as lower engagement with the Church. It is an important opportunity to ask the questions Pope Francis has posed to the Church globally, Dr Duffy added: "What does God want of the Church in Ireland it's important to have that asked and to listen to the great variety of things that people say."
