A God of relationships-The Sunday Gospel by Fr Silvester O'Flynn OFM Cap. The Irish Catholic

Trinity and Mass One cannot understand the Mass without an awareness of the Blessed Trinity. How can we, puny mortals, reach up to God? The doxology at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer tells us how. In everyday conversation, we use many small words, known as prepositions, which express the position or relationship of one thing or person to another. Take note of these prepositions. We rise up in glorifying the Father, through Jesus (mediator), with him (our human brother) and in him (as members of his community), all united in the power of love that is the Holy Spirit.

The development of quantum physics has increased an awareness among scientists that no single unit in the universe exists on its own but is part of the whole. Even the word universe derives from the oneness of all diversity. A growing number of scientists who previously dismissed any idea of God, are now intrigued by the notion of God as an interrelated Trinity of Persons. It makes sense to them.

A global community The Covid-19 pandemic, so called because it had gone worldwide, affected everybody. Yet, even the worst situation can be the source of some goodness. Recalling the words of Pope Francis: "The human person grows more, matures more and is sanctified more to the extent that he or she enters into relationships with God, with others and with all creatures. In this way, they make their own that Trinitarian dynamism which God imprinted in them when they were created. Everything is interconnected, and this invites us to develop a spirituality of that global solidarity which flows from the mystery of the Trinity (Laudato Si' 240). We are created in the image and likeness of God, each one connected with others in knowing and loving. Recalling the words of Pope Francis, the Trinity has left its mark on all creation... and especially on human life.

Reflections Let us reflect now on the Blessed Trinity in a more prayerful way, guided by some holy people of the past. St Paul began his letters with a blessing such as, "The grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."
