'We are called to be a welcoming caring faith community who bring people to Jesus who sends us out with Good News for all'.

Points to Ponder from 'My Life in Your Hands' Thoughts and Words of the late Fr. John Cummins.

The gospel story today tells of the gripping encounter between Jesus and a Samaritan woman, a woman who was despised even in her own community, as a Samaritan and as a sinner, this woman from the margins, not someone with whom a respectable Jewish rabbi would converse. And yet here is Jesus, engaging her in this strange conversation about water. Pretty soon you realise that he's not talking about water from the well, physical water that you drink. His thirst is deeper, and he knows that she thirsts.

Jesus thirsts for those who do not know the way, for those who are lost in life, for sinners; he thirsts for their faith. The woman has a thirst she does not recognise, the thirst for life, the thirst for truth, the thirst for God. She stands for us. And it is Jesus who promises to quench her thirst. Here, midway through Lent, he promises to quench our thirst too. In Lent, we experience thirst; at Easter that living water is released.

There are so many unhappy people in our society, so many people searching, like the woman of Samaria. There are many like her, whose self-worth and self-esteem are poor, people who experience rejection, people who seem to have little purpose in life. To all of them and to all of us, Jesus says, 'I know your thirst, and I thirst for you; I thirst for your love and for your faith. And I offer you living water. Come, drink and be satisfied.'

Why are they talking at The Masses To raise awareness about the missionary work of the Church and the role of lay missionaries, both at home and overseas.


To thank the people of the Meath Diocese for your support for our work over the years.
