Three Steps

The parable of the Good Samaritan brings out the practical nature of authentic charity. There are three steps in his response to the plight of the man dumped in the ditch.

The first step in love is to see people, to be aware of them and attentive. Our eves open the shutters of our aloofness when we take notice of people. Being attentive we hear them knocking on our doors, seeking entry into our lives. But so often we are experts at ignoring people and keeping them out.

The second step is to answer the knock and let the person in. The Good Samaritan was moved with compassion for the injured traveller Compassion literally means feeling-with, responding to the pain of the other person. When others knock at the door, compassion lets them in and is willing to reach out to them, whether it is in sharing tears in their sorrow, or celebrating with their joy or giving to their emptiness.

The third step in charity is to translate feeling into practical action. It is amazing how many excuses we can find to avoid helping somebody in need. But really, there is no excuse to justify failing to assist somebody in a case of life or death. The two churchy men were guided by harsh legalism to pass by on the other side.

But when the Samaritan came to the scene, he was moved with compassion at what he saw. His hands sprang into practical action.

151 St Mobhí Road, Dublin D09 HC82.

ACN Church Resources Designated Activity Company is now the publisher of Intercom -this began with the April 2025 issue, the third of volume 55, a reminder that 55 years ago 1969, Intercom began as a new Post-Vatican II pastoral and liturgical resource. It also will publish the Liturgical Calendar for Ireland and the annual Irish Catholic Directory. The new publisher is an arm of ACN (Ireland) and part of ACN (International), founded in 1947 as a response to the needs of German people displaced after the World War and now supporting almost 6,000 Christian communities worldwide, in135 countries, aiding priests, religious communities, lacking the means or and infrastructure to carry out their mission. In 1979 it began its Children's Bible project, publishing and distributing 51 million copies around the world in189 languages.

In very practical terms, ACN Church Resources will publish and supply the liturgical books previously managed by Veritas as well as Pre-nuptial Enquiry Forms, copies of certificates (Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage, Letters of Freedom) and parish registers. Contact ACN Church Resources on:
